

Community Emergency Response Team Training Course

Community Emergency Response teams(CERT) are trained to take care of themselves and then help others in their communities in times of emergencies or, up to 72 hours following a disaster. This is when the debris-clogged or damaged roads, disrupted communications, or high volume of calls may prevent access by emergency response personnel. The purpose of the CERT training is to provide citizens with the basic skills required to manage virtually all their own needs. Then if needed to be able to respond to their community needs in the aftermath of a disaster. CERT training is a prerequisite to joining a CERT program in your community. If you would like to be prepared or, volunteer and serve your community this is your first step.
